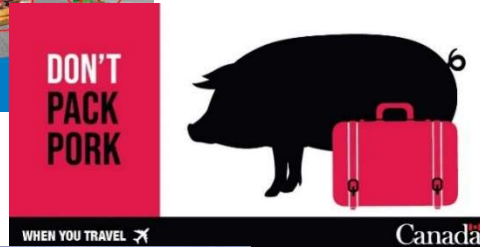
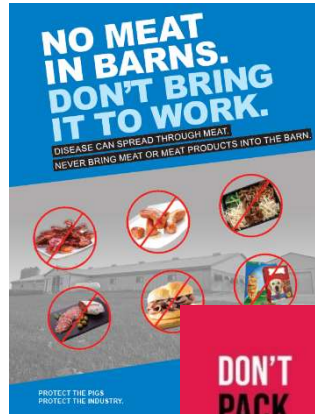


## PROVINCIAL

The **Ontario Swine Incident Command Centre (OSICC)** continues to work on projects with our OMAFRA and CFIA partners related to:

- Depopulation and Disposal Methods
- Hog Reduction Modelling
  - How to 'right-size' the industry to address market interruptions and protect long-term industry viability
- Resource Management
  - Determining resource stock on hand and storage (e.g., PPEs)
- Industry Engagement
  - Securing commitments of support from industry partners
  - Small producer outreach and education campaign
- Communications
  - Planning communication requirements for producers, industry, government and media
- Disease Surveillance and Traceback Tools
  - ARC&E, PigTRACE (CPC)
- Simulations to test programs



## NATIONAL

Highlights of recent work from the **National African Swine Fever Executive Management Board (EMB)** include:

- Canadian Invasive Wild Pig Strategy draft completed, in the consultation phase
  - 10-year strategy focused on eradication of wild pigs in Canada
- Movement Control working group focused on developing strategies for voluntary movement controls in case ASF is highly suspected
- Hog Supply working group focused on recommendations for managing national hog supply surplus due to ASF border closures
- Coordinated Risk Communications team working on prevention communications, such as the 'Don't Pack Pork' campaign
